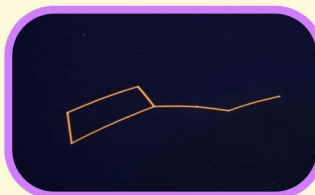
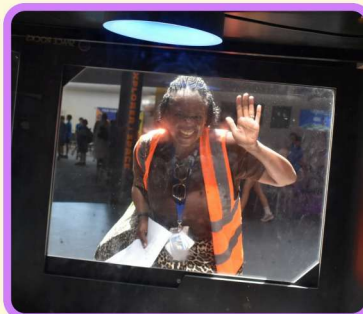

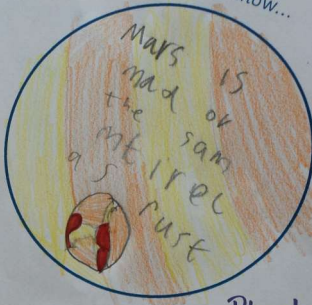


Year 3 - Marvellous Minibeasts

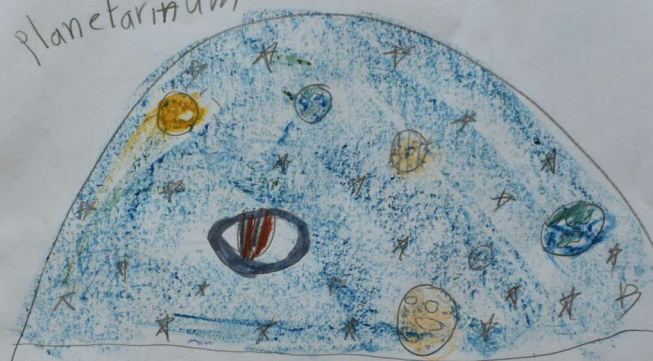

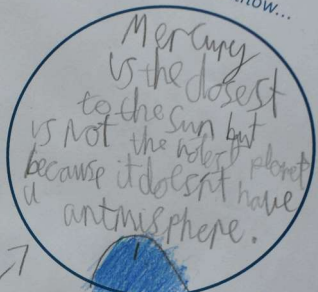

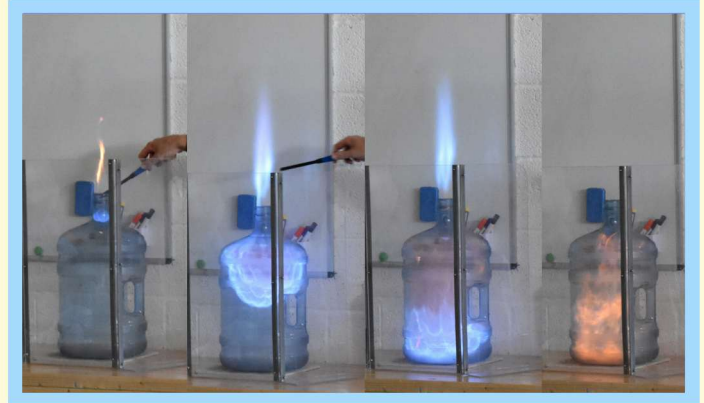
Year 5 - Blast Off!
