

### R.E. Hall Display: Symbols of Faith

We're delighted to share our new R.E. display, created by Mrs Church and Miss Clark, which brings key Bible stories to life through meaningful symbols. These visuals are helping our children connect with the stories they hear in class, making abstract ideas more accessible and memorable. Each image represents a moment or message from the Bible that supports our school values.

#### Here's a little of what's featured:

#### Sunrise behind a cloud:

Symbolising new beginnings and hope, echoing the theme of resurrection and God's light in the world.





#### Three crosses on a hill:

A representation of Good Friday, showing the crucifixion of Jesus.

#### Shepherd's crook and sheep:

Representing Jesus as the Good Shepherd, who cares for and protects his followers.





#### Loaves and fishes:

Symbolising Jesus feeding the 5,000, a story of generosity and miracles.

#### Colourful coat:

Representing Joseph's coat of many colours, reminding us of resilience and forgiveness.





#### Star over a stable:

Reflecting the Nativity and the star that led the Wise Men to baby Jesus.

#### Noah's Ark with a rainbow:

Symbolising God's promise and the story of Noah, reminding us of faith, trust, and new beginnings.





## Our R.E. Curriculum

The Surrey Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education was approved and adopted by Surrey County Council in May 2023, for use in Surrey's schools from 1st September 2023. A gentle reminder that this is the syllabus we teach at Cranleigh.

The syllabus has been constructed to help schools to sequence their RE curriculum in a way that is coherent, utilises multi-disciplinary skills and builds pupils' schemata, from Reception through to high school.

In addition, the syllabus helps pupils to understand their own and others' worldviews, religious and non-religious, and appreciate the influences of these on everyday life.

The syllabus supports the recommendations of <u>Ofsted's RE</u> Research Review.


