#### **MESSAGES**


As we come to the end of another academic year, I want to take a moment to thank all of you for your continued support, kind words, and the generous gifts shared with staff today; they are very much appreciated.


































#### This week at Cranleigh

# SCHOOL UNIFORM UPDATE

A gentle reminder, from September, we are updating our <u>Uniform Policy</u> to allow plain black trainers or trainer-style shoes as part of the school uniform.

To maintain a smart and consistent look, these must be entirely black, including the soles, with no coloured logos.

We're making this change to be more inclusive and practical for all pupils, helping them move comfortably and confidently throughout the day—whether they're running, climbing, jumping, or simply enjoying active play. It may also save some families money; if your child already owns suitable trainers, there's no need to buy an additional pair of shoes.

Children can, of course, still wear normal school shoes if they/you prefer.


