# COLLECTION PASSWORDS: FROM SEPTEMBER

From September, any adult who does not usually collect your child will need to provide a password to the class teacher before your child is released.

These passwords will be stored securely on our register system (Arbor).

#### **ACTION NEEDED BEFORE THE END OF JUNE:**

If your child is in Reception through to Year 5, please email the school with a <u>one-word</u> <u>password</u> of your choice. You'll need to remember this password and share it with any adult collecting your child who isn't listed as a contact on Arbor.

HERE COMES THE SUN

#### Make the most of vour summer by staying SUN SAFE

Sun safety practices allow you to enjoy the summer months freely without compromising your health.





Keep out of the sun at the hottest time of the day, between 11am and 3pm

Regularly drink water and limit your alcohol intake

If you are going to do a physical activity, plan to do this during cooler times e.g. early morning or evening



When outside, cover up with suitable clothing such as an appropriate hat and sunglasses, seek shade and apply sunscreen with at least SPF 30 and a four star UVA protection

Check on family, friends and neighbours who may be at higher risk of becoming unwell, and if you are at higher risk, ask them to do the same for you

If you are concerned about yours or a loved one's health during hot weather, seek medical advice by visiting 111.nhs.uk

#### **ATTENDANCE**

#### **Penalty Notices**

If you take your children out of school without authorisation for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- 1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
  - 3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under section 444 of the Education Act 1996.

#### **ATTENDANCE:**

#### PUNCTUALITY REMINDER

If your child arrives after the register closes at 8:55am, they will receive a late mark.

## These late marks contribute to periods that may result in a fine.

We will soon be sending letters to families whose children are regularly arriving late and who may now be at risk of a fine.

Arriving late means your child may miss the beginning, or even all, of a lesson. This can have a significant impact on their learning, as they may not understand what to do.

## Please make sure your child arrives at school by 8:50am each day.

## Gypsy, Roma, Traveller & Showman Families Travelling for Work Purposes: Advice for Parents

Does your work require you and your family to travel?



Have you spoken to the school about your travel plans?



Has your child been in school for 200 sessions (100 days) in the past 12 months?



Have you completed a leave of absence request form?



Can you give a date when your child will be returning to school?







The Headteacher can authorise absence

- School should provide access to online learning or a work pack
- You can try to dual register at another school

The Headteacher cannot authorise absence

- · Your child may lose their school place
- You may be given a fine

#### Frequently Asked Questions

Can I take my child out of school to visit sick relatives, attend weddings and funerals?

Headteachers can only authorise absences in exceptional circumstances.

What if I don't have a return date?

- · Give the school as much information as you can regarding a possible return date
- Call your child's school every week and keep them up to date with any changes


