SCHOOL UNIFORM UPDATE

From September, we are updating our [Uniform Policy](#) to allow plain black trainers or trainer-style shoes as part of the school uniform.

To maintain a smart and consistent look, these must be entirely black, including the soles, with no coloured logos.

We're making this change to be more inclusive and practical for all pupils, helping them move comfortably and confidently throughout the day—whether they're running, climbing, jumping, or simply enjoying active play. It may also save some families money; if your child already owns suitable trainers, there's no need to buy an additional pair of shoes.

Children can, of course, still wear normal school shoes if they/you prefer.

Surrey Paediatrics Parenting Service



The Paediatrics Parenting Support Service is offering support to parents and carers living in Surrey who are exploring the possibility that their child, aged 5 or younger, may be neurodivergent, exhibiting challenging or avoidant behaviours, or seeking help to improve their child's social and emotional skills.

Our practitioners provide a 6-week group intervention, either online or face-to-face in the community, to empower families with strategies and resources for their child's development and well-being.

Our service encourages parents/carers to explore the early developmental stages of young people, offer a deeper understanding into emotional regulation, explore strategies that can be used at home and shared with childcare provisions.

Our practitioners provide a 6-week group intervention, either online or face-to-face within the community with the option to bring young people along.
