This **World Mental Health Day**, we will be joining thousands of schools and communities across the country to support YoungMinds and show young people that they are not alone with their mental health.


On **Friday 10th October**, children are invited to wear something yellow to school in exchange for a donation (please see the link below).

Robins Class Request


