As we come to the end of this half-term, many of our classes have been thinking in detail about big questions around faith, identity and celebration as part of their R.E. learning.

Children across the school have been exploring what it means to belong – thinking about family, community, and how different faith groups welcome others. They've also looked at why festivals matter, learning about celebrations such as Eid, Vesak, Shavuot and Pentecost. We've also spent time looking at stories from sacred texts including the Bible, Torah and Qur'an, and the values these stories teach.

The half-term break provides a great opportunity to talk with your child about what they've been learning. You could ask: What makes a celebration special? Why do people follow different faiths? What values matter most to your family?




